Therefore, how many students we can have is directly related to how many we can put into a house. This year we only had room for 30 new students, which means we turned away 130 applicants! Next year it will be worse. We are expecting 200 applications for a similar number of openings! Also, we hope to begin a full-time masters degree course. Many of these students are married and they will come with their families, so we need housing!

Next June, Mobile Mission Maintenance (MMM) Australia is sending a team to build four new married student houses. However, we need the building materials first.
